
EXAMPLES OF SOCIAL RETURN ON INVESTMENT

Children supported by LifeScape have complex care needs with **2/3 having 3 or more diagnosis** (autism, speech delay, sensory disorders, cerebral palsy, ADHD, incontinence, constipation, along with motor skills challenges and developmental issues).

- Sioux Falls' population has grown from 50,000 in 1948 when children's services first began to 180,000 today. LifeScape operates out of 14 different facilities in Sioux Falls to accommodate growth in demand.
- ◆ Nationally, **1** in **6** children have a developmental disability and the number is growing.
- ♦ Autism now impacts 1:54 births up from 1:150 in 2000.
- ◆ It is estimated to **cost the public \$1.4M to \$2.4M** for the education and care of an individual with autism through their lifetime.
- ♦ Early intervention costs \$240K-\$400K for 4 years of treatment which has been statistically proven to materially impact the ability of the individual to integrate into society saving a minimum of \$1.2M per person with autism!

BUILDING A WORKFORCE TO MEET THE NEED

◆ There has been an incredible 1,942% increase in autism therapy-related jobs since 2010:



For perspective, there are 166,000 clinical and counseling psychologists; 112,040 mental health and substance abuse social workers; 139,820 mental health counselors and 91,040 substance abuse counselors in the United States.

- Demand for autism therapy-related jobs has significantly increased because of better diagnostic capabilities, access to services and increased insurance coverage for autism spectrum disorders.
- LifeScape employs 38 of South Dakota's licensed Applied Behavior Analysis
 therapists. We could double this workforce and still have waitlists. Investing
 in workforce development benefits the children and families of South Dakota
 by increasing their access to care.
